Milwaukee Proudly Announces 2009 March Honorees

Our Irish honorees for 2009 are a great mix of the old and the new about the Club. Chuck Ward is a three-time Club president, and a former St. Patrick's Day Parade director. He helped initiate many things that are a part of the Club today. He has also served as entertainment coordinator for the Milwaukee Irish Fest for many years. And along with that, he has played in Blarney for many years. He is currently assistant director of the Milwaukee County Parks. Kathy Donovan has headed up events in the years she has belonged to the Shamrock Club. She has served as installation dinner chair, and worked with the Flemings on the picnic. Bill Sherry has acquired the nickname "The Ambassador" since he joined the Shamrock Club, in part due to his intense efforts to recruit members for the Club and Color Guard. Along with his wife, Anna, Bill has become ingrained in the workings of the Milwaukee chapter.

Ironically, even though he is greatly entrenched in the history of the Club, Chuck is actually the youngest of the group.

Selection is done on the basis of service to the Shamrock Club, the Irish community in Milwaukee and Wisconsin, and service to the community. Congratulations to Chuck, Kathy and Bill. They all embody these qualities.

Chuck Ward 2009 Irishman of the Year

Chuck Ward's involvement in the Shamrock Club and the Milwaukee Irish community started soon after his graduation from Marquette University in 1978. His brother Ed had started the Irish band *Blarney*, and played at several local Irish pubs, and Chuck met many of the local Irish. Ed later became President of the Shamrock Club, and Chuck joined the Board first as parliamentarian. Over the years, he held several offices and was elected President 1985, 1986, and 1989.

Many changes occurred during Chuck's leadership. The St. Patrick's Day Parade moved from Mitchell Street to North Avenue and its profitability increased. Ward served as parade director after the change. The club also started its involvement at the Bradley Center, netting even more revenue for many years. The club's membership and programming also expanded as it relocated its meetings to the Wauwatosa Civic Center.

Chuck was part of the origins of Irish Fest, another effort led by his brother. He has been the entertainment coordinator since 1985, and served on the festival board for many years, currently as vice-president.

Chuck also started the Greater Irish Open, an annual charity golf outing that has raised funds for the Ulster Project as well as the St. Patrick's Centre in Downpatrick, Northern Ireland. He is a founding member of the local Friends of St. Patrick Chapter.

Chuck remains active outside the Irish community as well, serving as founder and past president of the Friends of Lakeshore State Park, as well as past president of Positively Pewaukee. In June of 2009, he will be the honorary chairman of the Cancer Society's Relay for Life.

"The Milwaukee Irish community has grown exponentially over the past two decades," Ward said. "The Shamrock Club really was the nucleus of so much of this. Now there are many Irish

organizations in Milwaukee, and that is very healthy for our continued commitment to our heritage.”

Ward’s Irish heritage can be traced to his father’s family hailing from the Kells area of County Meath, and his mother’s from County Antrim. “Growing up in our family, you knew you were Irish. We never had any doubt about our heritage.” Ward has traveled to Ireland eight times.

Ward continues to focus on his involvement with *Blarney* [www.blarneymilwaukee.com]. After joining his brother Ed in the group in 1982, Ward kept the group going strong along with Kevin Stapleton and Dennis Murphy when Ed left in the late 1980s. The band is still going strong today, 34 years later, having performed through the US, in Ireland and in Canada. “Interest in Irish music is clearly multi-generational. We are seeing the grand-kids of those who came to see us at Nash’s Irish Castle in 1975!” Yes, it’s a testimony to the band, Ward says, but more so to the resilience and significance of Irish music in America.

Ward’s wife Cathy has also been an active participant in the Irish community, serving as a former Shamrock Club board member and a long-time Irish Fest coordinator. She was the festival’s Volunteer of the Year in 1991. Chuck and Cathy are the proud parents of Bridget, 22 and Colin, 18.

“I am humbled to be selected,” Ward said. “There are many good friends who have held this honor. Sadly many have passed on, but it’s a testimony to their commitment to their Irish lineage that we all continue to strive to keep our heritage alive, and proudly pass it on to the next generation.”



**South Central Announces
Charlene Ann Terry 2009 Irish
Rose And Bill Curran 2009
Irishman of the Year**



The phrase “Curran Brothers” is not new in Juneau County. **BILL CURRAN**, the 2009 Irishman of the year, is the current example.

In 1856, Peter Curran and Maria Flynn Curran, who were both born in County Leitrim, Ireland, became the original settlers on their Juneau County land. Peter’s Brother, Felix Curran also came to Juneau County to homestead a farm as well.

In the late 1800s, Peter’s sons, William B. (Will) and Pete went into business as Curran Brothers Warehouse. They not only sold goods but also bought the farmers’ produce and transported it for sale in Chicago. They had the first grain elevator in the area and many other daring innovations. It was a lifesaver for farmers to have a market for a cash crop.

Will married Catherine Power Curran of Evanston, Ill. (Her Father, Denis Power, came from Tipperary.) Their sons Charles, William R. and Thomas, all went to law school and came back to practice in Mauston. William R. left to serve as the local Judge from 1951 to 1980. The remaining Curran brothers’ law practice brought them professional recognition, including, Thomas receiving a presidential appointment to be a Federal Court Judge in Milwaukee from 1983-2006.

Thomas married Colette Curran of Blanchardville. Of their six children, three went to law school and returned to the Mauston Law firm. William T. (Bill), his sister Catherine Orton, her husband John Orton and Brother Paul Curran all practiced in the firm together. Paul left to serve as a Juneau County Circuit Judge. The firm has grown to eight lawyers including an office in Lake Delton. It continues the tradition with recognition as an “A” rated firm; admission into the American College of Trial Lawyers; and inclusion in Super Lawyers magazine.

Bill married Joelle Curran of Sioux Falls. Their two sons, Peter J. and Alexander W. are still in school so where they will land is yet to unfold. Perhaps a fifth generation farming or in business together continuing the Curran Brothers tradition is possible. Each generation of the family has been a civic leader in church, city,

county and beyond. In addition to his Juneau County civic assignments Bill has recently been recruited to serve on the Board of Directors of the Greater Sauk County Community Foundation to further local charitable causes.



CHARLENE ANN (KOHLMEYER) TERRY was born June 24, 1938 in Reedsburg, WI to Mary (Donahue) and Fred Kohlmeier. Charlene's maternal ancestors are 100% Irish. Her Donahue great-grandparents immigrated from the Irish Free State to the U.S. in 1859, settling in Reedsburg, WI. Charlene's Hayes great-great grandparents immigrated from Ireland to the U.S. in the 1840s and settled in Dellona Township. Charlene's paternal Kohlmeier and Hoeverman ancestors immigrated from Germany to the U.S. in the 1860s and settled in Loganville, WI.

Charlene graduated from Reedsburg High School in 1956. She graduated from Sauk County Teachers' College, then UW-Platteville with her lifetime license to teach elementary education. Charlene married Patrick L. Terry Feb. 27, 1965 at Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Reedsburg. Charlene then moved to Baraboo where she joined Pat on his dairy farm. She has been an active member of St. Joseph Catholic Parish since. Pat and Charlene have farmed and lived on Hogsback Road, Baraboo since they married.

Today, Charlene continues to do the bookwork for Terry Farms and devotes her life to her family and church. Pat and Charlene have three sons and one daughter: Joe (Kristine) and Jim (Kristin) both operate Terry Farms with Pat and Charlene; Annemarie (Dan) is a teacher (all of Baraboo), and Patrick (Becky) is a realtor in Sun Prairie. Charlene and Pat often get to see their children and six beloved grandchildren: Samantha 13, Mary 11, Zachary 10, Josephine 9, Jake 6, and Grace 2. Charlene is a wonderful grandmother, always willing to baby-sit and help in any way she can. Charlene regularly baby-sits her youngest grandchild while the others love to spend time at the farm and at grandma and grandpa's after school and on weekends.

Before staying home to raise her own children, Charlene taught fourth grade at Waterloo Elementary, Beaver Dam-Wilson,

Madison-Hoyt, and Reedsburg Elementary. While raising her family and doing bookwork for Terry Farms, Charlene taught CCD, served as Home and School President, room mother, and volunteer for J-Club and in many other capacities for her children at St. Joseph School, including substitute teacher. Charlene never missed a single event of any of her children from grade school through high school.

Charlene is a past President of the Sauk County Deanery, active in the Madison Deanery. She was a long-time St. Joseph Baraboo Bingo worker, Parish Council, and Liturgical Commission member. Charlene currently serves as a Minister of Hospitality/ Greeter. She is a member of the Council of Catholic Women, Daughters of Isabella, the Art and Environment Committee, and St. Martha's Circle. Charlene also continues to substitute teach at St. Joseph School. She is a member of the South Central Shamrock Club and past member of Sauk County Homemakers and the Sauk County Dairy Promoters Committee.

Charlene also served her community through working elections in the Town of Baraboo. In 1996, the Terrys hosted the Sauk County Dairy Breakfast, and they continue to host students on farm tours.

Charlene is a woman deeply devoted to her faith and family. She has lived and taught by example; she has always put others before herself. She is honored to be your 2009 Irish Rose.

Spirits are STILL Bubblin' In New Dublin

The Shamrock Club of New Dublin Celebrates Silver Anniversary
– 25 Years of St. Patrick's Day Tradition in New London

This year is a milestone year for the Shamrock Club of New Dublin. On March 21, we will celebrate 25 years of St. Patrick's Day parades in New London. This tradition actually has its roots in what began as a lark. While the local police were at the high school watching over school traffic and other juveniles, Mike Coyle, Judy McDaniel, Fluff Barrington, Dave Mulroy, Jim Clarke and others decided to take a department store dummy in an old wicker coffin and carry him from Coyle Tire to Midtown Restaurant performing an Irish Wake, in fact the first "Finnegan's Wake" in their own impromptu St. Patrick's Day parade. When it was found out, they were told if they wanted to do this the next year they needed a permit. No one imagined then that this humble beginning would grow into the largest St. Patrick's Day parade in the state of Wisconsin.

We started out small in 1984 being given only half of the street, but surprised everyone with our turnout and the next year they gave us both sides of the street! Today the streets of New London swell on

parade day with an estimated crowd of thirty thousand. The parade boasts over 130 entries including bagpipe, high school bands, and other unique musical groups, Irish dancers, business, club, organization and family floats, and many other unusual and beautiful entries. We have entrants come from miles away to perform in our parade. In the 25 years we've only had to cancel our parade once, and then we only moved it to the next weekend due to a snow and ice storm that paralyzed the area? otherwise the show goes on notwithstanding snow, wind, or rain. And yes, sometimes we even have a sunny, relatively mild March day!

The first Irish festivals were held above John's bar on South Pearl Street, and when we outgrew that space, we moved to the old American Legion on Wolf River Avenue. The Irish Fest tent when incorporated in 1991 and placed in the old F? parking lot was met by skepticism, not many thought it was a great idea or that it would work out. But each year the crowds have grown and the tent has had to grow with them. Our current structure which is erected in the Festival Foods parking lot measures 80x180 feet. It is the largest single structure we can get. Each year it provides traditional and unique Irish music. We've had headliners such as *Gaelic Storm* of the movie *Titanic* fame, *Leahy's Luck*, *Off Kilter*, and *Reilly* as well as this year's headliners *Rising Gael* from Madison, WI and the very popular *Seven Nations* from Florida. There are Irish vendors, food and beverages available all day in the Irish Fest tent. For an admission fee of only \$5 you can enjoy fine Irish fare from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. It's a great value.

Yes, St. Patrick's Day has put New London on the map. In fact in 2006 we were voted by AOL on-line as the 11th best place in the United States to celebrate St. Patrick's Day. Our Parade, Irish Festival, and week-long events as well as Finnegan's Wake have been featured in newspaper, magazine and media pieces around the country as well as in publications around the world. The past few years WLUK, Good Morning Wisconsin has come to Northport (or "North Dublin") to do a live show during St. Pat's week from Pup's Irish Pub promoting our events; featuring Amy Hanten and Angela Kelly.

But the Parade and Irish Festival are just the culmination of a whole week of all things Irish for our club beginning with the changing of the city's name by our own "leprechauns" to "New Dublin" on Monday of St. Patrick's week, and the city streets are lined with Irish flags and painted shamrocks. This changing of the city's name is made by official proclamation of the Mayor each year. Over the years thousands and thousands of pounds of potatoes, cabbage and corned beef have been served in local restaurants including Pup's Irish Pub, Half Nelson's and other fine establishments on Tuesday, Hooligans Day. Irish caroling is heard in local nursing homes on Wednesday night and on Thursday our 'Evening of Irish Entertainment' at the New London High School draws a large crowd to enjoy a mix of music, song, dance and variety. Admission is free. The Ceili at Crystal Falls on Friday evening is really a sight to behold and each year the crowds get

bigger. This free family event brings young and old together to learn forms of a sort of Irish square dance complete with Ceili band and a caller. A good time is had by all and the laughter is contagious. And of course who can forget poor Michael Finnegan's unusual Irish Wake also on Friday evening, complete with Father Coyle, the widow and various mourners at Pup's Irish Pub and other local establishments?

But we're truly not only about the celebration and support of our events has allowed us to give back to our community many, many times over the years in the form of charitable donations to worthy causes throughout our area. We also continue to support New London's "Sister City" partnership with Killaloe; in County Clare, Ireland.

The hard work and dedication of Shamrock Club members past and present have made this a New London tradition for the past 25 years. The Grand Parade kicks off at 1 p.m. on March 21, 2009 with former mayor Wayne Tolzman serving as Grand Marshal. We'll honor Jeanne Trauger as our Irish Rose and Bill Fleese as our Irish Man for 2009.

Yes, folks after 25 years, "Spirits are *still* Bubblin' in New Dublin". We look forward to many more years of providing St. Patrick's Day celebrations in New London. Come and help us celebrate!
