2010 Irish Fest Showcases Northern Ireland

Northern Ireland will be featured at this year's Irish Fest through a special 'Northern Ireland Showcase.' The showcase, spread throughout the festival grounds, will highlight the culture, heritage, and music that have helped shape this country steeped in history. Northern Ireland will be represented at several of the must-see venues at Irish Fest 2010, including the Moore Street Market, The Cultural Exhibit Pavilion, Hedge School and numerous musical stages.

The Moore Street Market will house many of the finest artisans and craftspeople from Northern Ireland. Visitors will find student artists from Southeastern Regional College in Downpatrick, GAA retro jerseys, jewelers and fabric artists. Paintings of Ireland and Irish people from artist Martin Driscoll will also be on display at the Moore Street Market.

Of course, the Showcase will feature many additional musicians as well. Tom-my Sands, Tom Sweeney and Seamus Kennedy, all natives of Northern Ireland, will be playing at the Celtic Roots Stage which will be the main showcase stage for Northern Ireland artists. *McPeake* will launch their new album 'These Days' at Irish Fest, bringing their blend of traditional, acoustic and folk music to Milwaukee. The exciting sound of *Different Drums of Ireland* returns with their rich symbolism of the Lambeg and bodhran

drums representing the traditions of Northern Ireland. Len Graham and Brian Hart are both accomplished singers and will combine their talents at the festival. Another festival newcomer, Kieran Goss, is well-known for his folk, pop and alternative music and will be making his U.S. debut at the festival. Kintra's masterful blend of Irish and Scottish sounds is a must see while *Bracken* promises to put on a great live show as well.

The Cultural Pavilion will feature the history and culture of Northern Ireland and will include exhibits on *Narnia*, from the C.S. Lewis series of books based in County Down; a replica of the *Titanic*'s hull, housing an exhibit from Belfast; Stormont, an exhibition on Northern Ireland's parliament.

Located in the Gaeltacht Tent will be *Aisling Ghéa* from Belfast, Ireland's only professional theatre company working full-time to deliver great performances through the medium of Irish language. The group will be performing, 'Stones in his Pockets.'

The Hedge School will offer a series of lectures by leading authorities in Irish history, literature, language, and culture. Among them will be Sandy Smith, from the C. S. Lewis Foundation in Belfast, Dr. Tim Campbell, from the St. Patrick Centre in Downpatrick, and singer-songwriter Tom Sweeney, from Omagh. Singer-songwriter Tommy Sands, from Newry, will host a discussion on the role of the artist in the peace process.

Returning to the Hurling Area is the very popular hurley maker, Philip Doyle. Be sure to stop by the hurly hitting cage, where you can try your skills in the ancient Irish sport. The *Bangor Drama Club* will return to the Theatre Pavilion, along with several other theatre companies from Northern Ireland.

Celtic Soccer Goes Undefeated in Spring; Advance to Four-Team Playoff For League Title

The Celtic Soccer Club won three more games in June, finishing the Spring Campaign undefeated.

“We were tough to handle all year long,” said a gleaming Al Moss. “When it came down to it, we had more heart. Well, looks like a little more skill, too.”

They also had a lot of goals to go along with that heart and skill. The Celtic Soccer Club have scored 33 goals in only eight games so far this spring, an average of just over four goals per game. However, Tim Devlin credits solid defense and seamless team chemistry as the real keys to their success.

“I’ve been playing on this team for a lot of years,” said the older statesman Devlin. “But I’ve never played with a group of guys that just click together the way we do. We all know one another, but more importantly, we all trust one another. That’s a big deal in this game.”

That trust was evident in Celtic’s first game on June 5th against the reckless Caribbean Kickers. Each time the two teams have met this season, both sides left bruised and battered. This game was no different, resulting in a 3-2 Celtic victory and one green player visiting the hospital to be treated for a concussion.

Nick Hammel, Mohamed Elsayed and Mike Kroeger all scored goals for Celtic. However, after the game thoughts and prayers

were with Ryan Schuettpelz. Late in the second half, Schuettpelz took a violent elbow to the head from a competing Kickers player. Celtic needed to shake the bittersweet day off their backs because they had another game against Polonia the very next day.

“It was tough,” said Steve Krall. “We knew we’d miss Ryan in the middle, but these guys came together and really played hard. We won that game for Ryan.”

Win they did, tallying six goals and dominating the home team, Polonia. Trevor Hess led off the scoring early, but he was soon followed by Brendan Murphey and Aaron Abert, each netting beautiful crosses from Scott Baldwin to give the men in green a 3-0 lead at the half. The second half had the same result as the first with Cem Vurusaner, Mike Mallett, Brandon Chapman and Abdallah Elsayed all scoring to put the game out of reach.

Celtic wrapped up their stellar Spring Season with a June 13th matchup against USA Palermo Due. Fittingly, the regular season finished the same way it started, with a Celtic victory as they easily handled Palermo, 5-3.

The green barrage of goals came from a variety of players, none more surprised than defender Dan Koth. “I’ve always wanted to score but can never get a good chance!” elated Koth. “I’ll probably drink a beer or two to celebrate this one.”

Kroger, Hess, and Mallett were the usual suspects on the score sheet, while Andy Rawlskey also netted a goal in the victory.

Next up: playoffs – July 10 at Polonia Soccer Park and guess who Celtic plays in the semifinals? Yep, the Caribbean Kickers?
