## The Irish in American Politics

The Irish have been a part of the election process in the United States since the earliest days of the nation. The Ulster Scots and the Irish Catholics made up a majority of George Washington's army, and later would affect the first election. Andrew Jackson's election was pushed forward by a coalition of Protestant and Catholic Irish. And the presidential election of 1884 featured Grover Cleveland and James G. Blaine, in one of the dirtiest campaigns ever in American politics. It was also a contest that pitted the two candidates in an attempt to attract the Irish votes with an "I am more Irish than my opponent" strategy. Both men had family from Northern Ireland, of, in the vernacular of the day, "Protestant stock," but Blaine had a mother who was raised Catholic. Cleveland won.

With this preamble, we are just re-minding you that the Shamrock Club elections are here again. Please come out to vote on May 6.

## **World Championships of Irish Dance**

A number of Shamrock Club members who are dance teachers went to Ireland for the World Championships of Irish Dance. They included Bridget Jaskulski from Glencastle; Natalie Howard from Trinity; and Marisa Rondinelli and Maura Heck from Cashel Dennehy. Milwaukee dancers did well.

The Cashel Dennehy under-16 Girls Ceili team won the U-16 World Ceili over Easter week in Glasgow, Scotland. This makes Cashel Dennehy the first Wisconsin Irish Dance School to attain this high honor, and only the second ever from the Midwest. Paving the way for this great achievement, the girls won the Midwest Championship title over Thanksgiving in Columbus, Ohio and then went on to be crowned All Ireland Champions in Killarney, Ireland in February. At the Glasgow competition the girls competed in two rounds to win against 45 world class dance teams.

The winners are: Gabrielle Caron Schuler; Natalie Rondinelli; Kate Abbott; Kayla Jashinsky; Lauren Sayles; Mary Beth Jablonowski; Mackenzie Bryant; and Jessica Gibson.

In addition to the team, 10 Cashel Dennehy soloists qualified to dance at the World Championship.

Four Milwaukee area dancers, representing Trinity Academy of Irish Dance, took the world stage. Ten-year-old Maggie Nowakowski, a 5th grader at University School in Mequon, took 4th place in her first trip to the World Championships.

Bridget Smith-Jaskulski, went over with her student, Breeanne Glavan-Johnson. Breeanne qualified for the World Championships at the Mid-America Championships in November, 2009 where she received fourth place.

Breeanne competed in the Girls 18-19 category at the Worlds on Friday, April 2nd. There were 100 dancers in the competition and Breeanne received 55th place. While only 38 dancers received a call back, Breeanne was 17 away from a recall at her first Worlds.



Bloomsday is an annual commemoration observed on 16 June in Dublin, Ireland and elsewhere to celebrate the life of Irish writer James Joyce and relive the events in his novel *Ulysses*, all of which took place on the same day in Dublin in 1904. The name derives from Leopold Bloom, the protagonist of *Ulysses*, and 16 June was the date of Joyce's first outing with his wife-to-be, Nora Barnacle, when they walked to the Dublin village of Ringsend.

John Gleeson is Dublin-born and bred; he is director of the Celtic Studies department at UWM and a long time promoter of all things Irish in Milwaukee. He has led countless tours to Ireland, including studies for UWM students for part of their academic credits.

All lectures are held from 5:30–7 p.m. at Greene Hall, 3347 N. Downer Ave. on the UWM campus. Plenty of street parking at the door with a wheel chair access ramp. This is our twelfth year of lectures without interruption. The public is always invited. We offer tea, snacks and a promise of a delightful couple of hours. Cost: \$7.

### **Karan Casey Band at ICHC on May 22**

Karan Casey, one of the most original and influential voices in Irish music, will perform at the Cultural and Heritage Center, 2133 W. Wisconsin Ave., Milwaukee, on Saturday, May 22, at 7:30 p.m. Backing Casey will be Caolmhin Vallely on piano, Kate Ellis on cello, and Robbie Overson on guitar.

Pre-concert music in Quinlan's Pub will be provided by Milwaukee traditional band *Ceol Cairde* from 6:30-7:15 p.m.

Casey was first introduced to American audiences as lead vocalist of the Irish "supergroup" *Solas* in the mid-1990s. She had immigrated to New York from Ireland in 1993 to pursue a jazz degree at Brooklyn's Long Island University and met up with the future members of *Solas* while attending Irish music sessions.

After almost five years with *Solas*, Casey embarked on an award-winning solo career in 1999. She pushes the boundaries of traditional songs and seamlessly mixes them with the contemporary as well as her own compositions. The most recent of her five albums, *Ships in the Forest*, is a return to more traditional material, including a cover of Joni Mitchell's antiwar song, "The Fiddle and the Drum," which reflects Casey's passion for social justice. Casey says that it is important for her to make every song she sings her own.

Casey has been involved in performing and recording projects and collaborations with a who's who of Irish and folk performers, among them the late Liam Clancy, former band mates Seamus Eagan and John Doyle, Peggy Seeger, and Mick Moloney as well as her husband, accordionist Niall Vallely.
