



Ireland's First Minister for the Diaspora Visits Milwaukee

On Saint Patrick's Eve, March 16th, Jimmy Deenihan TD, Ireland's first ever Minister for the Diaspora, honored Milwaukee with a visit to the city. The day began with a breakfast with local business leaders. The Minister then made his way to the ICHC to view the LABOR AND DIGNITY: James Connolly in America exhibition, currently on display there. He was shown around the exhibit by John Gleeson from UWM Center for Celtic Studies, one of the sponsors of the exhibit.

Mr. Deenihan then sat down for a chat with board members of the ICHC, Genealogical Society, Milwaukee Irish Arts, and Celtic Women Lectures. He introduced Milwaukee to the major theme of his visit, the recent launch of his government's GLOBAL IRISH, a new and exciting policy document on Ireland and the Irish abroad.

This is the first clear statement of Government of Ireland policy on the diaspora which recognizes that Ireland has a unique and important relationship with its diaspora that must be nurtured and developed. It seeks to connect, in an inclusive way, with those of all ages around the World who are Irish, of Irish descent or have a tangible connection to Ireland, and wish to maintain a connection to Ireland and each other.

Then it was off to City Hall for a meeting with Mayor Tom Barrett, City Council President Michael Murphy and other political leaders.

Irish Fest hosted a lunch at their Center in Wauwatosa for the Minister and a gathering of representatives from a number of local Irish organizations. He was introduced by Alderman Murphy and

spoke eloquently of the transatlantic relationship. He was fulsome in his praise for Irish Fest and its tremendous contribution to Irish-American culture. There was time for a tour of the world renowned Ward Archives before he was on the move again, this time for a meeting at UWM to see the Center for Celtic Studies and meet Chancellor Mark Mone and Celtic Studies Faculty. His day in our city ended with a visit to the UWM library where he was impressed with the wealth of Irish holdings including rare maps, books and manuscripts.

The Minister, who was accompanied by Irish Consul General Aidan Cronin and officials from the Irish Department of Foreign Affairs is very popular in Ireland. He represents North Kerry in the Dail (parliament) and is an accomplished Gaelic Footballer, holding five All-Ireland medals, won as a player for his county.

He left Milwaukee clearly impressed that the wealth and strength of Irish culture in this corner of the diaspora is immensely vibrant, varied, rich and lasting and something we all can be proud of.

Milwaukee Irish Arts (MIA) presents *MOMENT*, a play by Deirdre Kinahan at the Irish Cultural and Heritage Center (ICHC), May 7th through 11th, 2015.

The impact of a crime is rarely confined to the initial events experienced by its immediate victims. What of the impact on the families of the perpetrators? How difficult can it be for loved ones to forgive, let alone understand, terrible acts committed by their own kin? How does a family live and cope with the pain of a conflicted love?

This is the emotional landscape that Deirdre Kinahan has mined for her acclaimed play *MOMENT*. You can almost hear the Greek Chorus warming up. But Kinahan passes on that bait. Her triumph with this new play lies in her extraordinary lightness of touch and her ability to bed her drama down in the almost mundane details of family life. Here, ordinary actions - preparing of tea, setting of a table, the small talk of a family meal - are laced with hidden drama and unspoken hurt. It is drama of a most personal kind, and its sheer, simple truth resonates with us the more for it.

Jack Suit had surgery this past Tuesday.


